UNDERSTANDING WORKPLACE BULLYING: CLINICAL AND SYSTEMIC INTERVENTIONS

Pamela Raphael is a licensed Mental Health Counselor in WA State. She received her undergraduate degree in Contemplative Psychology from Naropa University and her Masters in Applied Behavioral Science from Bastyr University. She specializes in one-on-one support of adults who are recovering from interpersonal trauma, narcissistic relationship abuse and bullying. Narcissistic Abuse is the name given to coercive control and abuse behaviors in relationship not already recognized as domestic violence or bullying.



She also has specialized training in Workplace bullying from the Workplace Bullying Institute and has served on the board of the National Workplace Bullying Coalition. In addition, she has sponsored legislation in WA state on three occasions to try and advance workplace protections from workplace abuse. Currently, she has developed her practice around helping people affected by both of these all-too-common behaviors.
